Dear Friends,

Like many other nonprofits and businesses, our United Way was severely impacted by the pandemic. Looking back, the General Motor strike that occurred in the fall of 2019, caused a 32% decline in our workplace campaigns as many of our local tier II and tier III automotive suppliers were also on strike. Many of those companies were slated to go back to work just weeks before the state lock-down in March of 2020. The pandemic caused us a loss of 64% in our annual campaign. Even with two back-to-back devastating campaigns, our team responded quickly and was able to raise \$568,000 in our COVID Crisis Fund. We leveraged those dollars to fund 67 mobile food trucks which brought in just over \$2 million dollars in nutritious food to the community. 24 local schools received approximately \$186,000 each worth of personal protective equipment (gloves, mask, hand sanitizer, etc.). Through the CERA (COVID Emergency Rental Assistance) Program we have processed just over \$735,000 rent and utilities assistance to local ALICE families.

This past year has shown us even more the importance of working together. Community organizations, businesses, groups, churches, and individuals **UNITED** more than ever before to help the community through the COVID-19 pandemic. Take a look at some of our team below.

United For Active Community Impact and COVID Response Grants



\$232,000.00 disbursed to our local non-profits, pantries and shelters.

United For Warmth



\$40,000.00 in new winter apparel went directly to those in need in our community.

United For Hunger



\$2 million dollars in healthy, nutritious food provided to local families.

1,258 volunteers stepped up to serve **6,000 households** in our community.

United For Soles



Over 3,000 pairs of shoes were distributed to those in need throughout Montcalm - Ionia Counties.

United For Kids



More than 3,000 brown bags decorated and collected to help support the 700 meals provided every school day to local elementary children who are food insecure, through IM Kids 3rd Meal Program.

United For Seniors



2,400 rolls of toilet paper distributed to our senior shut-ins when none was available to purchase.

\$186,000.00 in PPE for 24 private, public, and one-room schools.

\$735,000 in rent and utilities assistance to local ALICE families, processed by our CERA (COVID Emergency Rental Assistance) specialists.

ALICE represents the men and women of all ages and races who get up each day to go to work. Nonetheless, they still face tough financial choices.

Poverty is a reality for many individuals and families in our community. However, unless you've experienced poverty, it's difficult to truly understand.

In 2019 43% of Montcalm County and 37% of Ionia County were ALICE and Poverty households struggling to make ends meet.

UWMI now offers an ALICE Simulator. It is not a game but based on real-life scenarios that exist and are of greater consequence to ALICE families.

It is United Way's aim that this simulator will:
